The DC Workforce Investment Council Developed the methodology to establish high-demand occupations

WIOA High-Demand Occupation Definition:

A demand occupation that currently has or is projected to have a significant number of positions in an industry sector, contributing to the state, regional, or local economy.

Criterion for DCWIC's High-Demand Occupations:

- 1. Identified Occupations in DC
- 2. Filtered occupations with positive growth over the 2022-2032 period
- 3. Filtered occupations that had 50 or more openings annually.
- 4. Filtered occupations with a minimum wage of \$17.00 per hour or higher
