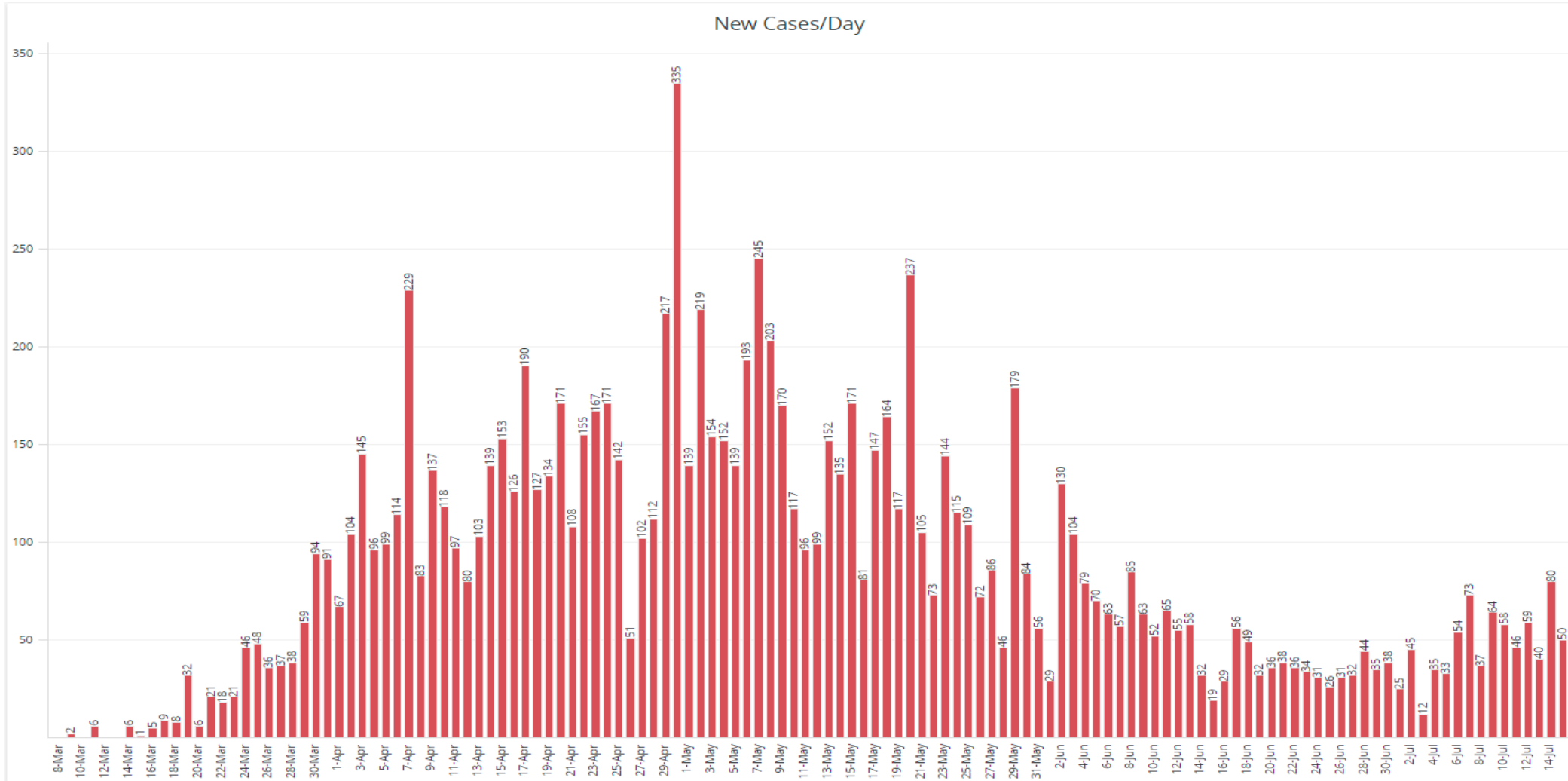

Where We Are Today

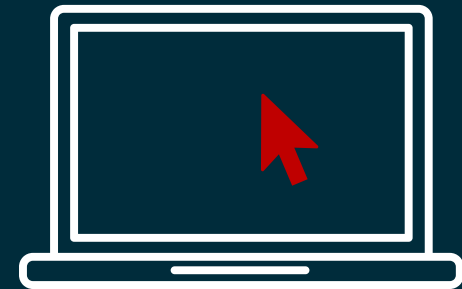
Metric	Where we are today (data as of 7/14/20)
Community Spread	
Sustained decrease in community spread	3 days
Low transmission rate (R_t)	$R_t = 1.06$
Testing Capacity	
Low positivity rate	3.0%
Health Care System Capacity	
Sufficient health care capacity without surge	79%
Contact Tracing Capacity	
Make first contact attempt for new positive cases within 1 day of notification	100%
Make first contact attempt for close contacts of new positive cases within 2 days of identification	97%

Students in need of **special education services, English language support, and other required support services** will still be eligible to receive these services regardless of the family's choice.

DCPS can guarantee all requests for **all-virtual** instruction. We will do our best to accommodate all requests for **hybrid** instruction but cannot guarantee space. Our ability to offer the hybrid schedule is dependent on staff capacity given strict health guidelines on class size.

Whether learning at home or learning at school, consistent student engagement is critical and attendance will be taken daily.
